1. Aland, Kurt, *Four Reformers—Luther, Melancthon, Calvin, Zwingli*, Augsburg Publishing House, Minneapolis, 1979. Brief biographies.
2. Bainton, Roland H., *Here I Stand*, Abingdon-Cokesbury Press, New York, 1950. Still the definitive biography of Martin Luther.
3. Bainton, Roland H., *The Reformation of the Sixteenth Century*, Beacon Press, Boston, 1952. A brief, readable introduction to the Reformation; out of print, but easily obtainable through used on-line booksellers for a buck.
4. Calvin, John, *Institutes of the Christian Religion*, Ed. J.T. McNeill, trans. F.L. Battles, The Westminster Press, Philadelphia, 1960. The most important work of one of the greatest theologians in the Church's history.
5. Chadwick, Owen, *The Reformation*, Penguin Books, Harmondsworth, England, 1964. 3rd in the Pelican History of the Church series.
6. Dickens, A.G., *The English Reformation*, PSU Press, University Park, PA, 1964, 1989.
7. Estep, William R., *The Anabaptist Story*, Broadman Press, Nashville, 1963. Vivid account of the radical reformation.
8. George, Timothy, *Theology of the Reformers*, Broadman Press, Nashville, 1988. Excellent treatment of the theological concerns underlying the Reformers actions.
9. Godfrey, Robert W., *Reformation Sketches*, P&R Publishing, Phillipsburg, 2003. Insights into Luther, Calvin and the Confessions from a Reformed historian.
10. Luther, Martin, *Three Treatises*, The Muhlenberg Press, Philadelphia, 1947. Luther's significant writings in 1520 which helped launch the Reformation.
11. McGrath, Alister E., *A Life of John Calvin*, Blackwell, Oxford, 1990. Probably the best biography on Calvin to start with. McGrath is very readable, but never light.
12. Monter, William, *Calvin's Geneva*, John Wiley & Sons, Inc., New York, 1967. Corrects much misinformation about Geneva at the time of Calvin.
13. Nichols, Stephen J., *Martin Luther*, P&R Publishing, Phillipsburg, 2002. Good biographical intro to the life of the great Reformer.

14. Oberman, Heiko A., *Luther—Man Between God and the Devil*, Image Books, New York, 1982. Excellent biography.
15. Oberman, Heiko A., *The Impact of the Reformation*, Eerdmans, Grand Rapids, 1994. Interesting essays including Luther's attitudes toward the Jews.
16. O'Connell, Marvin R., *The Counter Reformation 1559-1610*, Harper & Row, New York, 1979. Discussion of the period from a Roman Catholic perspective.
17. Parker, T.H.L., *John Calvin*, Lion Publishing, Tring, England, 1975. Good, basic biography.
