

UGANDA MISSION TRIP

(JAN) Covenant Life members participated in the sixth annual trip to Western Uganda; their work combined with fundraising efforts have resulted in construction of 12 fresh water wells and the planting of eight village churches.

BURMA MEDICAL MISSION

(JAN) Four Covenant Life members helped conduct a week of medical clinics, partnering with members of other Sovereign Grace churches.

EXPLORATORY TRIP TO HAITI

(FEB) Two Covenant Life pastors and three other members spent time with a Haitian pastor to explore partnering in his vision to reach Haiti with the gospel.

JAPAN DISASTER RELIEF FUND

(MAR) We received an offering of \$36,260 to support ministries that provided aid to the Japanese people in the aftermath of the Tohoku earthquake and ensuing tsunami.

ETHIOPIA MEDICAL MISSION

(MAR) Members from Covenant Life partnered with Covenant Life Church Addis Ababa and Mission to the World to provide medical and spiritual care to the poor in the Bole area, just southeast of Addis Ababa city centre.


RANCHO 3M BABY HOME

(JUL) Youth from Covenant Life offered a week of Christian day camps in communities close to the church, combining service projects with intensive, relational ministry.

WOUNDED WARRIORS MINISTRY

This ministry prepares and serves a bimonthly luncheon for approximately 100 of the patients, families and staff on the surgical floor of Walter Reed National Military Medical Center in Bethesda.

EVERY DAY IS CHRISTMAS

(NOV & DEC) Dennis Castaneda and other volunteers prepared and distributed both Thanksgiving dinners and Christmas gifts to needy families.

SOUP KITCHEN (THE LORD'S TABLE)

Servants from Covenant Life work alongside others to prepare and serve meals for the needy on the first Wednesday and fourth

12:13 CLASS

This energetic group of middle-schoolers (weekly attendance 150) cleaned a Gaithersburg stream, collected 86 shoebox gifts for Operation Christmas Child, air-dropped 100 Bibles to Marxist guerillas in Latin America through "Parachutes Over Colombia," and went Christmas caroling, handing out Bibles, gospel tracts, and invitations to the Christmas Eve service.

MEN'S SHELTER

This ministry serves the 200 homeless men at the Homebuilder's Care Assessment Center in Rockville with hot, home-cooked meals on the first Wednesday and the third Monday of every month.

PRISON MINISTRY

(WEDNESDAYS) A dedicated team extends friendship, care and compassion to inmates at Montgomery County Correctional Facility in Clarksburg through singing, Bible teaching and small group discussion.

BASKETBALL OUTREACH

(THURSDAYS - since Sept 2009) Drew Garfield and a small team of regulars from Covenant Life use our basketball courts to have fun, build relationships, and share the gospel with young men from surrounding communities.

FOREST OAK TOWERS OUTREACH

- (AUG) Our youth blessed residents of this public housing community for seniors with fellowship, cleaning services, donated \$1,500 to help provide birthday parties and other events for residents.
- (NOV) Joe Moorman and crew served a home-cooked Thanksgiving meal for about 80 residents.
- (DEC) Ellie Berry and Amy Barnett planned and participated in a Christmas concert attended by 40+ residents.


