Exodus, Part 14: Blessed Reassurance: The Covenant is Renewed

Exodus 33:18-34:10 Robin Boisvert November 15, 2015

Main Idea: In spite of the people's failure to honor God through worshipping the golden calf, God renews his covenant and reassures His people. In short, **God's gracious covenant love is stronger than our sin**.

Sermon Outline:

- 1. The LORD replaces the tablets
- 2. The LORD proclaims His name
- 3. The LORD's Attributes:
 - a. Merciful (or compassionate)
 - b. Gracious
 - c. Slow to anger
 - d. Abounding in steadfast love and faithfulness
 - e. Forgiving iniquity and sin

Key Quotes:

"The LORD passed before him there, and proclaimed, "The LORD, the LORD, a God merciful and gracious, slow to anger, and abounding in steadfast love and faithfulness, keeping steadfast love for thousands, forgiving iniquity and transgression and sin, but who will by no means clear the guilty, visiting the iniquity of the fathers on the children and the children's children to the third and the fourth generation." And Moses quickly bowed his head toward the earth and worshiped." Exodus 34:6-8

Fellowship Starters

- 1. Read Exodus 33:18 34:10 and open in prayer.
- 2. Discuss the attributes of God mentioned from Exodus 34 above and how Moses responded after hearing and contemplating what they meant for him and Israel.
- 3. Re-read Robin's quote about the value of the Bible and discuss why God's Word is so important to read, study and meditate on.
- 4. Jesus himself encourages us to see the Word as of greater importance than even food. What does he mean by that?
- 5. Discuss the different ways that group members are currently seeking God in the reading and study of Scripture and close in prayer for one another that we all might "grow in the grace and knowledge of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ (2 Pet 3:18)."
