Session 1 The Doctrine Located and Defined

- 1. The doctrine of salvation broadly covers all that God has done for us in Jesus Christ. Theologians have sought to show this in what is called the order of salvation (*ordo salutis*). It generally looks like this:
 - Election
 - Calling
 - Regeneration
 - Conversion (repentance and faith)
 - Justification (and adoption)
 - Sanctification
 - Glorification
- 2. The doctrine of justification is properly part of the saving work that God brings to us in Christ.
