“Revelation for Relationship” (Psalm 19)

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Main Idea: In today’s sermon on Psalm 19, Robin Boisvert helps us to see how though our God is invisible, he has revealed himself to us through Creation, His Word and His Son, Jesus Christ.

Sermon Outline:

Key Text/Quotes:

¹³ *Let the Words of my mouth
and the meditation of my heart
be acceptable in your sight,
O LORD, my rock and my redeemer.* Psalm 19:14

“[God’s] invisible attributes, namely his eternal power and divine nature, have been clearly perceived ever since the creation of the world, in the things that have been made. So they are without excuse.” Romans 1:20

Fellowship Starters:

1. Read Psalm 19 and open in prayer.
2. David declares that the Heavens (meaning the visible creation of stars, sun, moon, etc.) “speak” about God. What do they say? How is this so?
3. What does the Bible claim that all humanity’s response to these truths should be? Why is it that man rejects God and worships creation?
4. David goes on to declare that God’s more specific and personal revelation comes to us in His Word. Discuss David’s claims regarding the usefulness, goodness and benefits of God’s Word. Why is it that man rejects God and worships other false gods despite God’s revelation?
5. What is the posture of David in light of these truths? Discuss how he sees God as a gracious means of help, through prayer, to live a God-glorifying life, even including his thought life?
6. Close in prayer for each other, especially that this coming year might be one of great growth in our relationships with God in His Word.
